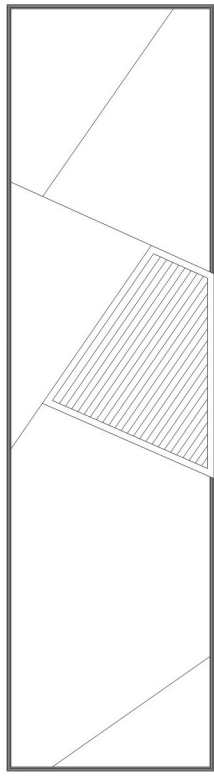

Door Size from 85 / 96 in Height to 31 / 39 in width



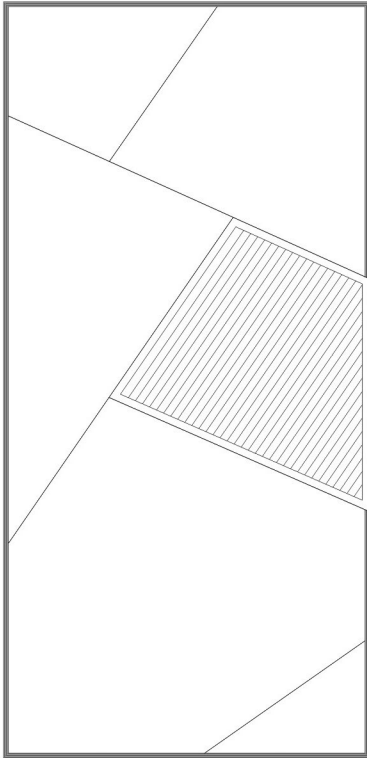

Door Size from 85 / 96 in Height to 24 / 30 in width



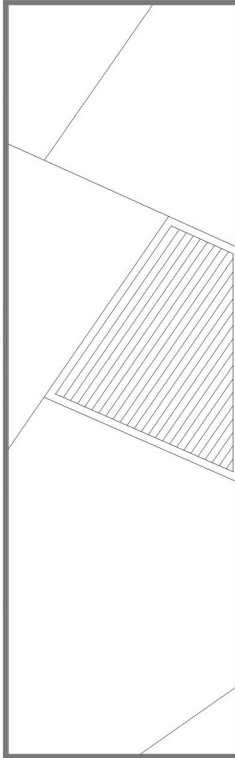

1101 - ASHOKA THE GREAT



Ashoka the Great (c. 304–232 BCE) :
Known for his role in spreading Buddhism and the Maurya Empire.
Famous for the Ashoka Pillars that bear his edicts.

1102 – CHANDRAGUPTA MAURYA

Chandragupta Maurya (c. 340–298 BCE):
Founder of the Maurya Empire and mentor to Ashoka.
Conquered much of the Indian subcontinent.

1103 – RAJA RAJA CHOLA 1



Raja Raja Chola I (c. 947–1014):
Emperor of the Chola Dynasty. Renowned for his architectural masterpiece,
the Brihadeeswarar Temple in Tanjore.

1104 – RANI PADMINI



Rani Padmini (13th century):

Queen of Mewar known for her legendary beauty.

Her life is associated with the famous story of the Siege of Chittorgarh.

1105 - CHHATRAPATI SHIVAJI MAHARAJ



Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj (1674–1680):
Maratha warrior king who established the Maratha Empire.
Renowned for his naval prowess and administrative skills.

1106 – PRITHVIRAJ CHAUHAN



Prithviraj Chauhan (c. 1166–1192):
Last Hindu ruler to sit on the throne of Delhi before the establishment
of the Delhi Sultanate.

1107 – RAJA BHOJA



Raja Bhoja (c. 1010–1055):
Paramara king and a polymath known for his patronage of arts,
sciences, and literature.

1108 – VIKRAMADITYA



Vikramaditya (1st century BCE):
A legendary king often associated with the Vikram Samvat
calendar and known for his wisdom.

1109 – MAHARANA PRATAP

Maharana Pratap (1540–1597):
Ruler of Mewar known for his resistance
against Akbar and the Mughal Empire.

1110 – RANI LAKSHMIBAI



Rani Lakshmibai (1828–1858):
Queen of the Maratha-ruled state of Jhansi,
a key figure in the Indian Rebellion of 1857.

1201 – MAHATMA GANDHI



Mahatma Gandhi (1869-1948):

Known as the "Father of the Nation," Gandhi led the non-violent civil disobedience movement against British rule.

1202 – SUBHAS CHANDRA BOSE



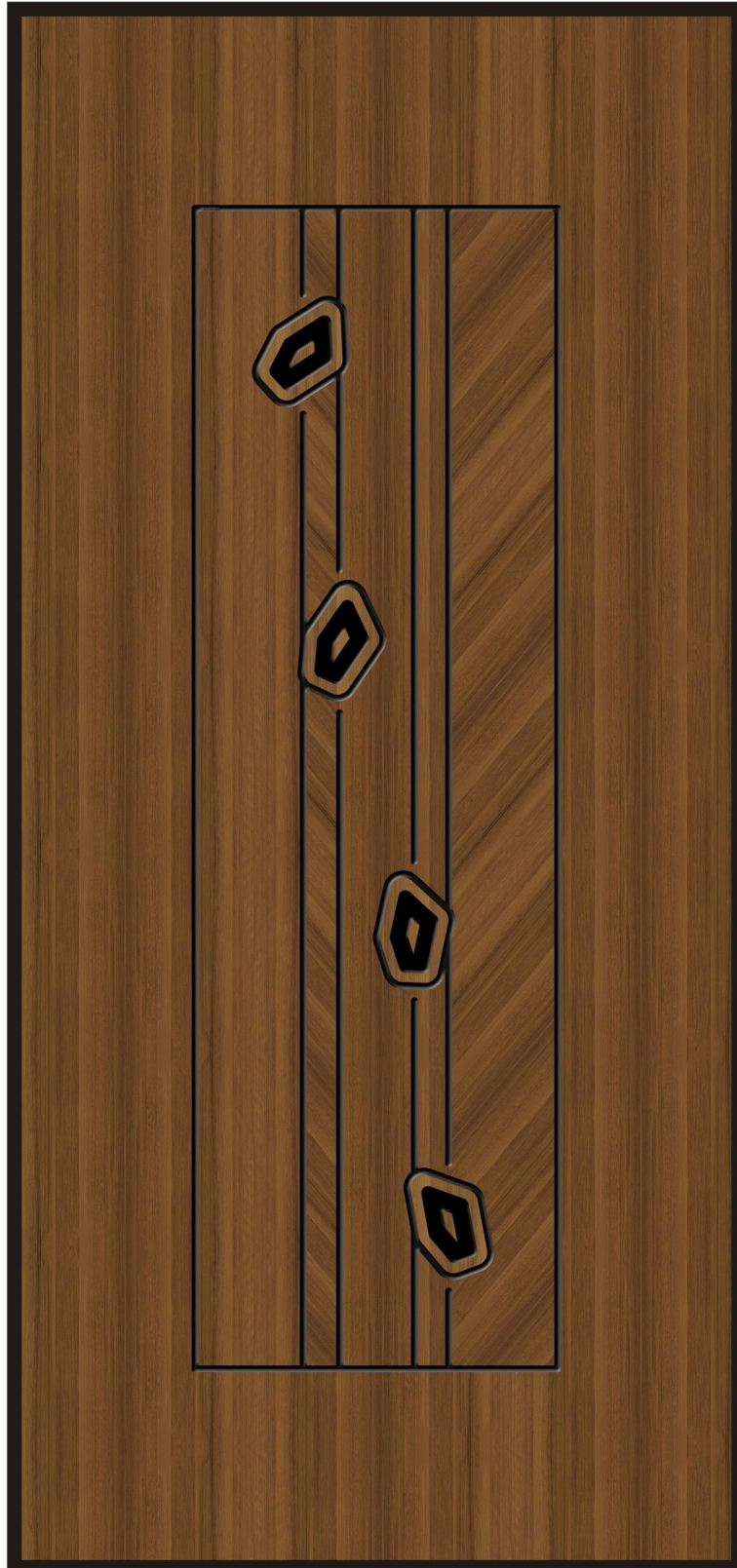
Subhas Chandra Bose (1897-1945):
A prominent leader who formed the Indian National Army
to fight against the British during World War II.

1203 – SARDAR VALLABHBHAI PATEL



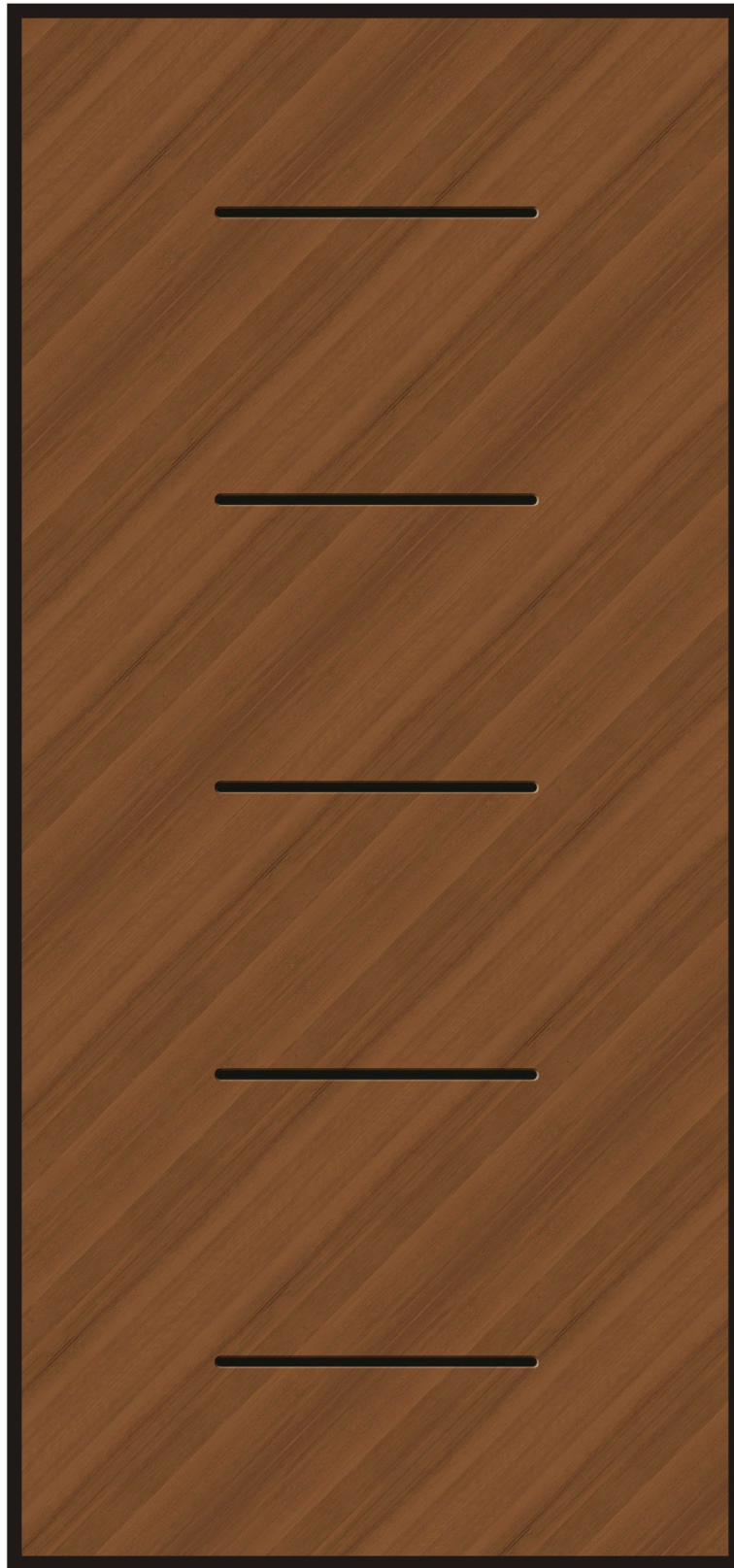
Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel (1875-1950):
A key figure in the Indian National Congress and played a vital role in the integration of princely states into the Indian Union.

1204 – BHAGAT SINGH



Bhagat Singh (1907-1931):
A revolutionary socialist who sacrificed his life for the independence
of India and protested against British rule.

1205 – CHANDRASHEKHAR AZAD



Chandrashekhhar Azad (1906-1931):

A fearless freedom fighter and a key member of the Hindustan Socialist Republican Association who sacrificed his life for the cause.

1206 – SAROJINI NAIDU



- Sarojini Naidu (1879-1949):

Known as the "Nightingale of India," Naidu was a poet, politician, and the first Indian woman to be the President of the Indian National Congress.

1207 - C.RAJAGOPALACHARI



C. Rajagopalachari (1878-1972):

A prominent leader in the independence movement, he served as the last Governor-General of India and as the Chief Minister of Madras State.

1301 – ADI SHANKARACHARYA

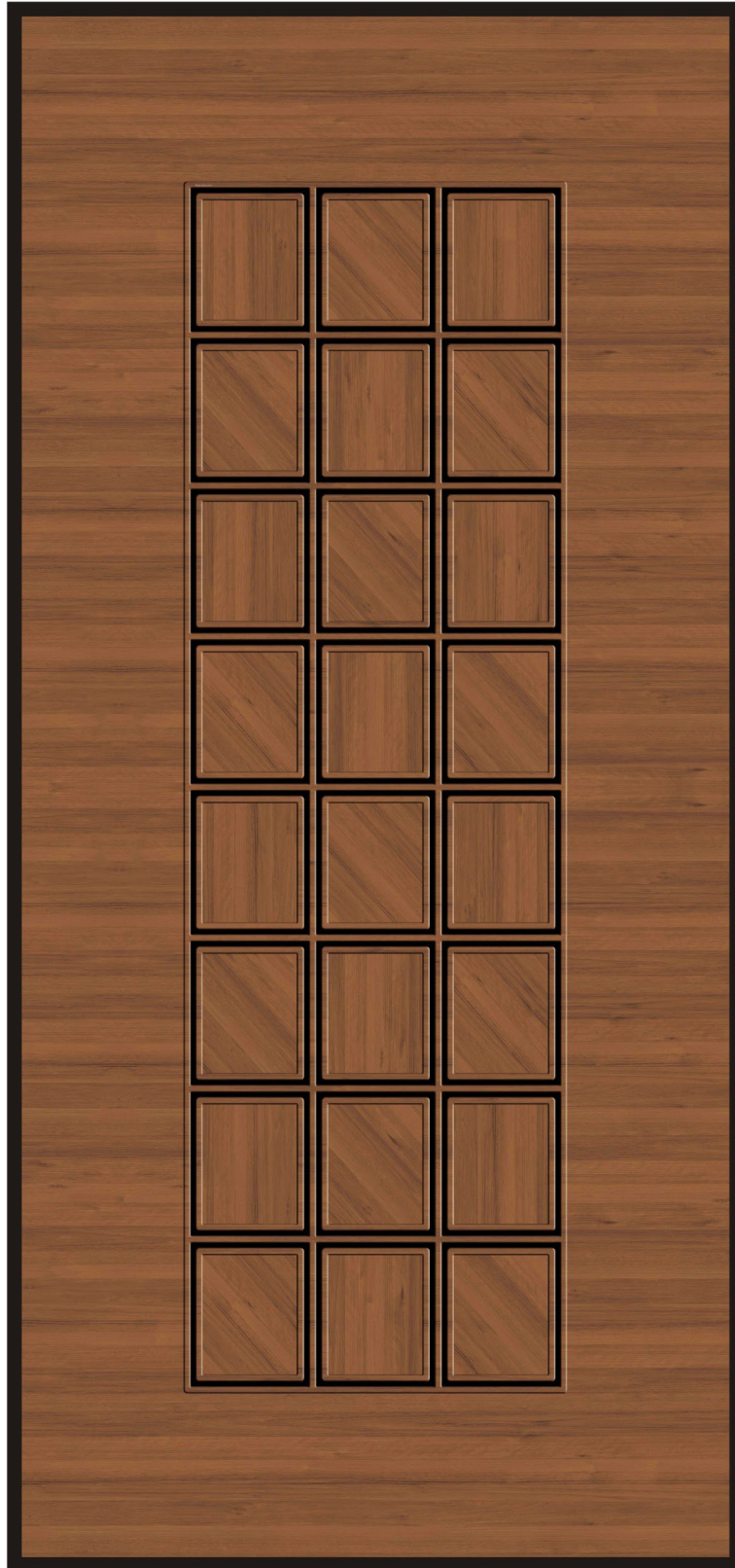
Adi Shankaracharya (788-820 CE):

Adi Shankaracharya was a philosopher and theologian who consolidated the doctrine of Advaita Vedanta. He is credited with unifying the diverse spiritual traditions of Hinduism.

1302 – CHANAKYA

Chanakya (c. 350–275 BCE):

Also known as Kautilya or Vishnugupta, Chanakya was an ancient Indian teacher, philosopher, economist, and jurist. He is best known for his treatise on statecraft, the "Arthashastra."

1303 – RAMANUJA

Ramanuja (1017-1137 CE):

Ramanuja was a theologian and philosopher known for his contributions to the Vishishtadvaita Vedanta school of Hindu philosophy. He emphasized the concept of qualified non-dualism.

1304 – KABIR

Kabir (1440–1518 CE):

Kabir was a mystic poet and saint who played a significant role in the Bhakti movement. His poetry transcended religious boundaries, promoting a message of unity and devotion to the divine.

1305 - TULSIDAS

(1532-1623 CE): Tulsidas was a Hindu poet-saint known for his epic poem, the "Ramcharitmanas," which narrates the life of Lord Rama. His work has had a profound impact on the devotional traditions of Hinduism.

1306 – SWAMI VIVEKANANDA

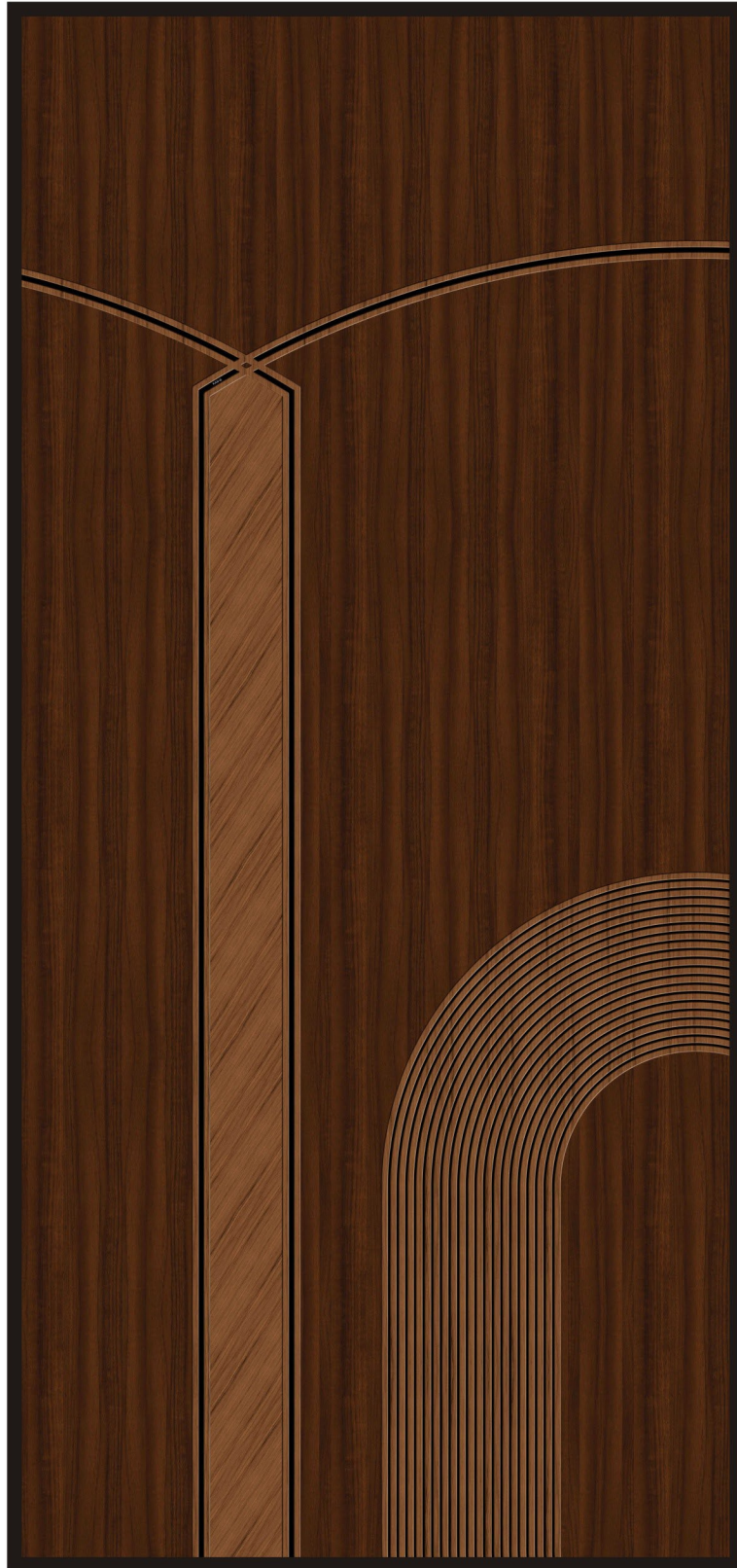
Swami Vivekananda (1863-1902): A key figure in the introduction of Indian philosophies of Vedanta and Yoga to the Western world, Vivekananda was a disciple of Ramakrishna Paramahansa. He promoted the idea of the universality of religions.

1307 – RABINDRANATH TAGORE

(1861-1941): Tagore was a polymath and a poet who became the first non-European to be awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature. His philosophical works explored the interconnectedness of humanity and nature.

3101 – SARVEPALLI RADHAKRISHNAN

Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan (1888–1975): A prominent philosopher and statesman, Radhakrishnan served as the first Vice President and second President of India. His philosophy focused on the harmony of religions and the spiritual essence of human existence.

3102 – B.R.AMBEDKAR

B.R. Ambedkar (1891-1956): An architect of the Indian Constitution,
Ambedkar was also a social reformer and philosopher.

He worked towards the eradication of caste discrimination and championed the cause of social justice.

3103 – A.P.J. ABDUL KALAM

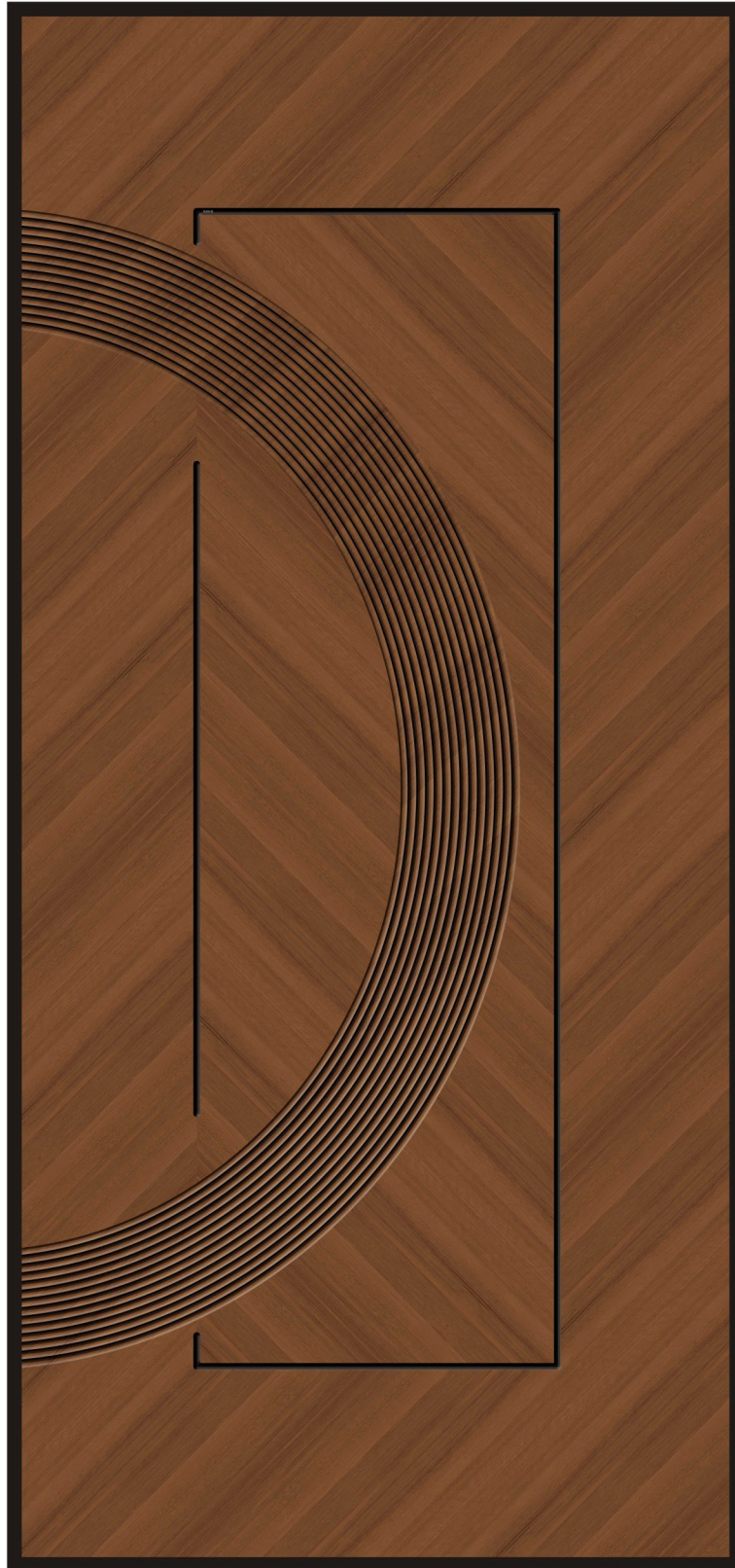


A.P.J. Abdul Kalam (1931-2015): Known as the "People's President," Kalam was a scientist, philosopher, and the 11th President of India. He emphasized the importance of education and ignited the minds of young Indians.

3104 – VINAYAK DAMODAR SAVARKAR

Vinayak Damodar Savarkar (1883-1966):
A proponent of Hindutva and a freedom fighter,
he was instrumental in the Swarajya Party and the Hindu Mahasabha.

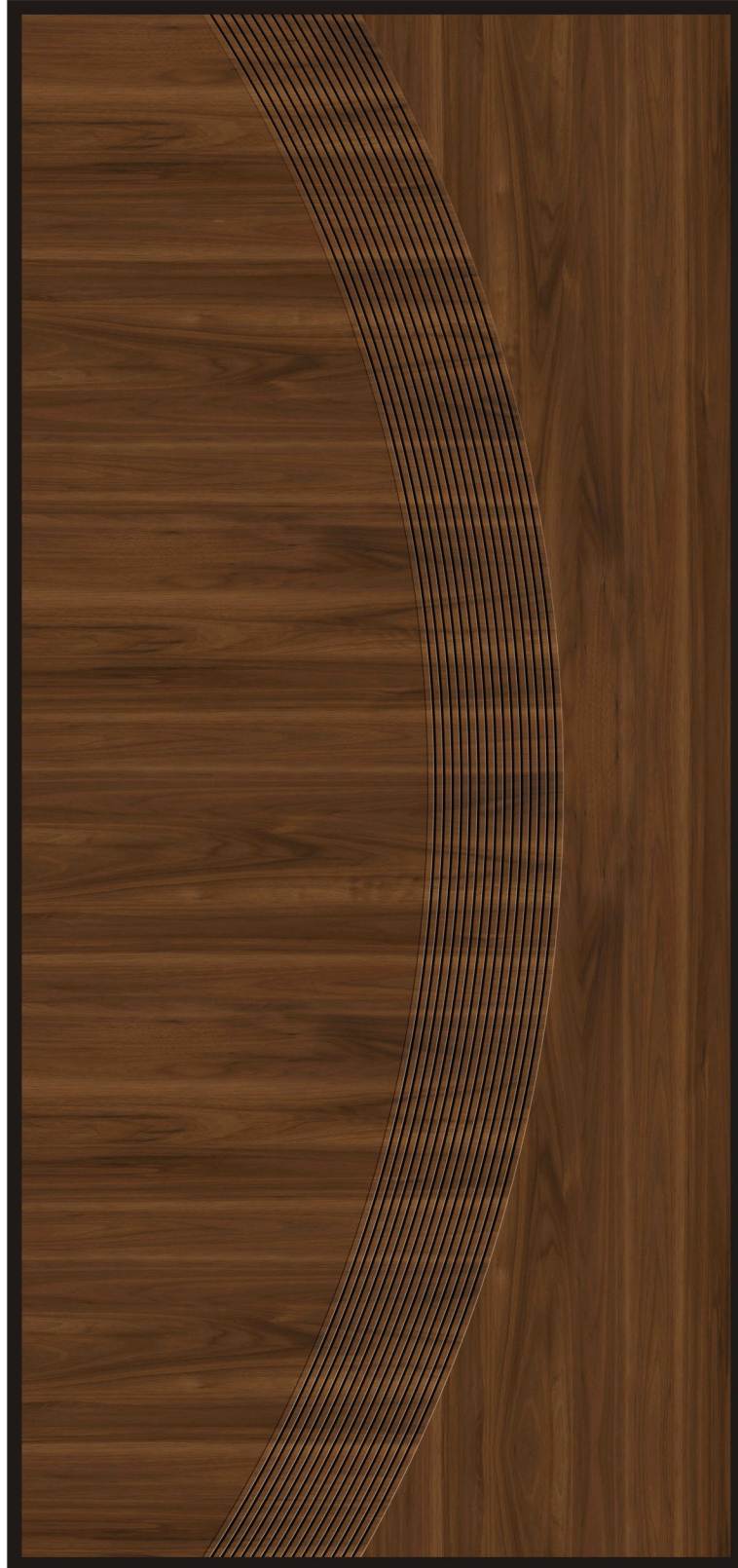
3105 – RAJENDRA PRASAD



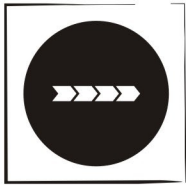
Rajendra Prasad (1884-1963): The first President of India, Prasad was a key figure in the Indian National Congress and played a crucial role in the Constituent Assembly.

3106 – KITTUR RANI CHENNAMMA

Kittur Rani Chennamma (1778–1829) was the courageous queen of the princely state of Kittur in Karnataka, India. She valiantly led an armed resistance against the British East India Company in 1824, making her a pioneering figure in India's fight against colonial rule.

3107 – BHARATHIYAR

(1882–1921): Mahakavi Subramania Bharati, a renowned Tamil poet, freedom fighter, and social reformer, who used his writings to inspire patriotism.
